The weapons sweeps allow the team to disrupt drugs activity and anti-social behaviour which are two of the ward priorities for Eastcote. Whilst doing the weapon sweeps and open space searches, the team have been able to interact with individuals on e-scooters and motorbikes causing anti-social behaviour. The Eastcote team have focused on increasing police presence on the ward and are therefore carrying out high visibility patrols on foot and by cycle. Recently PCSO Robinson carried out crime prevention leaflet drops in relation to catalytic converter thefts. The team are actively patrolling motor vehicle crime hot spots and are trying their best to raise awareness in relation to catalytic converter thefts and how best people can protect their vehicles. The team have focused on doing this as motor vehicle crime is also a ward priority. The team have also assisted in joint ward speed operations to tackle speeding issues on the ward. The now looking to phase in community engagements once again due to the lockdown being lifted
