Hello and a very warm welcome to the Eastcote Safer Neighbourhood Team's December newsletter. The team have had the pleasure of welcoming our very own new addition to the team, PC NEILD. PC NEILD is on an attachment on our ward for the next 6 months and working alongside the community. Throughout November the team have continued to conduct weapon sweeps in multiple locations to prevent and deter any potential criminal activity. The team have been active with high visibility patrols, interacting with the community and handing out our leaflets; spreading the word about STREETSAFE awareness. This allows members of the public to report the areas they feel unsafe in. More information about this can be found on the met police website for STREETSAFE as per the website listed above. The team have increased their high visibility patrols to target hot spot areas for Burglary, Robbery, Drugs, ASB and Motor Vehicle crime, with the aim to prevent, disrupt and deter any criminal activity. Eastcote officers have been busy identifying the suspects involved in the moped ASB in and around Pembroke Estate and are in the process of taking positive action. Our presence is essential and we understand the importance of our visibility in and around our ward. The team will be increasing their community engagements going forward to raise crime prevention awareness especially in the run up to Christmas. Please remain cautious as COVID is still present.
