Hello and a very warm welcome to the Eastcote Safer Neighbourhood Team's July 2022 newsletter. The team have been focusing on Anti social behaviour on the ward. We have received a lot of information from the public about youths on motorbikes travelling around Eastcote causing a nuisance. The team focussed their patrols in those areas. CCTV of these youths on bikes were obtained and s59 warnings were issued to the riders. Since the warnings were issued there have been no further reports received.

The Walk and Talk initiative involves female officers buddying up with women from their communities to go out on patrol in open spaces so that they can hear first-hand their experiences, concerns and reflections. The aim of the walkabout is to start a conversation between the public and officers about their safety concerns and what police can do, working with partners, to address them.
